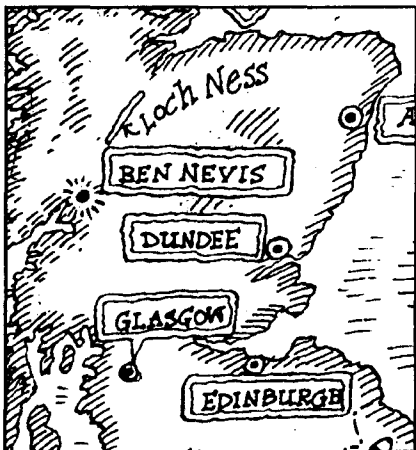
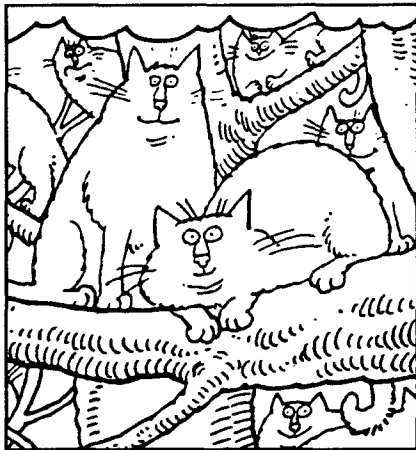


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To The Teacher

The language level of these puzzles varies from beginner's level to intermediate. At the back of this book you will find all the games and puzzles listed both according to level of difficulty and also according to topic or language point practised. We hope this will be useful in helping you to choose suitable material for your classes. This means that you can cross-reference the level of your class with topics which they will enjoy.

As well as actual answers to puzzles and notes on usage, you will note that the Teacher's Section at the back of the book also contains the analyses of the scores in the personality quizzes, so you will need to copy these for your pupils or be on hand to give them the information verbally.

A small clock on each page tells you approximately how long each activity should take.

Occasionally you will have to photocopy several pages for one activity, for example pages 3 and 5, and pages 33 - 36. Choose which language points, topics or vocabulary you want your pupils to practise, and you will find puzzles, quizzes or personality tests which will test their skill and improve their English at the same time.
